Cogenco working with Tesco to dramatically reduce energy consumption

17 May, 2006 Horsham, West Sussex. Cogenco are pleased to announce the successful commissioning of a combined heat and power unit at the new Tesco site in Swansea. The 210kWe containerised unit was commissioned at the end of March this year.

In a recent announcement Terry Leahy, Chief Executive, outlined plans to reduce energy consumption in all Tesco buildings. The introduction of CHP is one area where significant savings can be made, and the target in the new Swansea store is to reduce energy by one-third.

The added benefit with the installation apart from the reduction in energy costs, are the significant reduction in CO₂ emissions. There is also the additional savings to be made with the Climate Change Levy, for which all of Cogenco's units have been stringently tested.

Dudley McDonald, Business Development Director commented, "We are delighted to be involved at the early stages of Tesco's new environmental strategy. We have had previous successes in the retail sector which is an excellent area to make significant energy savings and reduction in CO₂ emissions".

All of Cogenco's combined heat and power units are assembled and pre-commissioned and transported from their UK Headquarters in Horsham, West Sussex. The units remote monitoring also takes place from the monitoring centre based there.
